

Shotgun update:

New Year's Day and President's Day shoot both went well. We had 14 shooters on New Year's Day and 8 on President's Day. The weather was generally cooperative.

The partnership with the Berne Knox Westerlo (BKW) school trap team is proceeding, albeit slowly. The BKW Conservation Club has all of the paperwork ready to go. They hoped to get Board of Education approval in February, but it was bumped from the agenda due to the sudden retirement of the high school principal requiring most of the available meeting time. This is scheduled to be heard at the March meeting. Traina's Bait and Tackle (Knox) has offered to procure ammunition for the team. HRGC has generously offered the clay pigeon for free to help the startup.

To provide more content to the membership it is going to offer "hands on" mini workshops to the members following the regular monthly meetings. These sessions will run 30-45 minutes and any members interested can stay after the meeting and participate. Frank Fuss will offer the first of these workshops following a soon to be announced meeting. Frank will explain how to reload shotgun shells and the considerations you need to get started. He will bring in a single stage reloader and participants can try their hand loading shells at the end of the session. Frank claims his experience includes loading shoot shells for more than 10 years and well over 50,000 rounds.

The Shotgun League will start up on Wednesday, April 6th at 6 pm. All are welcome.

Lastly, one of the members asked about the status of a "Trap Shooting" workshop like ones conducted in the past. Frank Fuss stated he is just about done with the PowerPoint type presentation and wants to show it to the Trap Core Group for the final tuning. The workshop should be ready to go before the summer vacation season sets in.

Our first "in person" meeting was held on 3/10—seems like forever since that happened. Hopefully COVID is gone enough to not make a comeback strong enough to cancel meetings! 25 Members attended the March meeting.

Ray Haines took time speaking of the updates to the constitution and bylaws. Members expressed some feedback and there were some adjustments made based on that. We hope that we can vote on this at our April meeting so that we can get this two-year project behind us and move forward. If you have any comments or questions, please reach out to the EC and we will do our best to help.

RANGE UPDATE!

We are finally gaining momentum on the range improvements. This is very exciting news as it has been a long time coming! The ½ thick polycarbonate panels are here and installation is literally days away. This stuff is extremely substantial and will cover the windows as a safety precaution. Hardware and the hardwood to build the garage door covering is in process and once this is complete BOTH ranges can be used at the same time. This is a HUGE improvement to the club and will alleviate some of the wait times and limitations to your range time.

We decided that we need to buy the steel now to rework the backstops. There are some serious flaws with the existing (which is why there are limitations to what rounds can be fired inside). This is a very large job that is being taken on and we will need many hands to complete. The scope of the work will be cleaning out the sand pits, removing the wooden structure and installing steel panels followed by rebuilding the shooting lanes. Once this is complete the types of rounds able to be used will be dramatically increased. This is another huge benefit to the club and what it offers our members. We want to complete this project shortly after the pistol league moves outside for the summer.

Outside: We desperately need fill to build up the barrier berm between the pistol/archery range and the 100-yard rifle range. If anyone knows of where we can acquire some, please let someone on the EC or grounds committee know. Accomplishing this will offer us so much more opportunity as well as turn us into a simultaneous multi-use facility—another huge benefit to the club.

We also hope that we can accomplish the bridge so that we can access the 200-yard target point easier.

We are also starting to update signage and postings in and around the facility and property

you can still see clearly inside and out.


